Online Classes by Regina Loubier

The polar vortex (or as some might call our "normal" Canadian winter) forced me like most of us to spend more time indoors and in my instance, in front of the computer. While browsing through carriage driving related websites, I discovered that Andy Marcoux of Coachman's Delight (www.coachmansdelight.com) was offering online classes. I was excited to try one out as there was not much opportunity to drive this winter with the lack of facilities and the extreme cold and at least I could be increasing my knowledge and hopefully improving my skills to be a better driver. Mr. Marcoux is a recognized judge for The American Driving Society for the sport of Combined Driving, an evaluator for The Carriage Association of America's Carriage Driver Proficiency Program and holds the highest level of certificate available from The British Driving Society. He also writes for The Carriage Driving Digest.

The live online classes are set up by Andy on the Cisco WebEx website. The classes are held two consecutive nights - one for the folks on the west coast which starts at 10PM and the second for the folks on the east coast which usually starts at 8PM. They run about 2 to 2 1/2 hours. When it is time to join the class, Andy emails an invite to paid participants to the WebEx meeting. You click on the Join button. He also has a practice signing in session a couple of days in advance to make sure people can



join the class with no difficulty. High speed internet is necessary to be able to participate in the classes. A class is \$25US by PayPal or you can mail in a US money order or cheque for \$20 to save \$5. I sent in a US money order for 3 classes to save on postage as well.

After joining the meeting, you can see and hear Andy through his webcam on a screen in the top right hand corner of your monitor screen. To the left is a whiteboard where the power point presentation he has prepared runs. You have the option of being viewed through your own webcam. You can ask questions through your microphone or type in your questions in a chat window. He encourages questions and there is a question period at the end of every class. Within two days after the online class, the links to the recordings as well as the slide show and any other documents are made available for download to watch again or save for reference.

The first class was "Building a Half-Halt" during which he explained what a half halt is, how to do it and when to use it. He also gave us skill building exercises to practice the half halt. I enjoyed this class (and Mr. Marcoux's sense of humour) so much that I paid for the next three classes in advance.

The second class was "Level 1 Driver Proficiency Training". He offered coaching information that he shares with students when they are having a lesson to prepare for their Level 1 evaluation. Topics included harness types, their care, maintenance and fitting; carriage balance, inspection and maintenance; horse care; and finally do's and don'ts when hitching, driving and returning with your horse.

The third class was "Better Reinsmanship through Muscle Memory". He described and showed the different methods of holding the reins explaining the advantages and disadvantages of each and showed us exercises to practice so that certain rein handling moves would become automatic.

The fourth class was "Understanding Contact" where he discussed range of contact, developing contact, variations of contact, driver's position, rein direction, length of frame, and carriage position. (I confess I fell asleep close to the end of this one. It's a good thing, I was able to download it and watch it again!)

On January 29 and 30, he will be offering a class on Marathon Timing and Navigation and on February 13, Reinsmanship through Muscle Memory II.

Although the classes are almost finished for this year, I would certainly recommend members to try them next winter.

Gerry was no stranger to the Ottawa Valley. Gerry judged for me at the Carp Fair during my time on the Fair Board; he conducted a clinic at Sunset Farms for EOPDS; and was almost a weekly visitor to the Ottawa Valley in the 1980's at the farm of the late Don Prosperine, a longtime member of EOPDS. Donnie had a passion for the Canadian Horse and Gerry had the driving



knowledge and the driving skill to help him achieve success, culminating in the showing of a Four-In-Hand of his Canadians to a Coach both at the Royal Winter Fair and at the Canadian Carriage Driving Classic. Over the years Gerry was able to help many pleasure drivers with his knowledge and great powers of observation. EOPDS offers their condolences to his children and their families and to Nicky Gluck, his beloved companion and soulmate for many years. He will be missed by many in the pleasure driving world.
